Today is our last home game of 2023, a year which has seen the lads come through a difficult second season at Step 4, and undergo a management change. Hopefully 2024 will prove more successful.

Today's opponents have made a steady start to life at Step 4, and sit in 7th spot in the table, and are poised to mount a play off charge.

We have already met once this season, down at Westfield Lane, when the two sides clashed in the Second Qualifying Round of the FA Trophy. Badshot got off to a great start and led after a couple of minutes, and although we pulled one back we trailed 2-1 at the break, and an early goal in the second half made it 3-1. We kept battling but couldn't get level, and slumped to a 5-3 defeat, our goals from Isy Nzelo, Conan Torpey and Max Oldham.

Our last home game, the not to be forgotten "missing socks" fixture saw us slump to a 3-1 defeat against Thatcham Town. Despite the delayed kick off, and upheaval to their preparations, it was the visitors who settled quickly, scored early on and that left us chasing the game and we never looked like getting back into it.

Following that, the lads ended a three game losing streak when holding league leaders Chertsey Town to a 0-0 draw at Alwyns Lane. Considering our form going in to the game and the fact that Chertsey had a 100% home record, this was a tremendous effort, and showed exactly what the boys can do.

In the Surrey Senior Cup, the one remaining cup competition we are in, we have been handed one of the toughest draws, as we host Chertsey Town at a date still to be confirmed.

On the playing front, Sam has made some tweaks to his squad, with defender Rylan John and midfielder Courtney Swaby both moving on. We thank them both for their service.

After the delights of the win over unbeaten Cray Valley PM in the Isthmian Youth league, the wheels have come off our U18's title challenge a bit. Rather than pressing home the advantage, they have gone down to a narrow 3-2 home defeat against Corinthian, and then followed that by picking up a 1-1 draw at lowly Chatham Town, to put the ball firmly back in the Cray court.

Enough from me, enjoy the game and have safe trips home.

BADSHOT LEA FC

FORMED: 1904

NICKNAME: The Baggies



The club was established in 1904, although they only played friendly matches until affiliating with the Surrey County Football Association in 1907. They subsequently played in local leagues before joining the Surrey Intermediate League, winning Division One in 1936–37 and again in 1937–38. They won the division again in 1985– 86,[3] earning promotion to the Surrey Premier League. However, they were relegated back to the Surrey Intermediate League the following season after finishing second bottom of the division.

Badshot Lea won the league's Challenge Cup in 1987–88 and the Invitation Cup in 1989-90. They were relegated to Division Two, but won the division in 1992-93. They won the Challenge Cup for a second time in 2000–01. In 2003 they moved up to Division One East of the Hellenic League. They won the Supplementary Cup in 2005-06, and after finishing third in 2006-07 they were promoted to the Premier Division. However, after one season in the Hellenic League's top division, they were transferred to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League, swapping leagues with AFC Wallingford. Their first season in the Combined Counties League also saw them enter the FA Vase for the first time.

The following season saw Badshot Lea make their debut in the FA Cup, eventually losing 10-0 to Ashford Town (Middlesex) in the second qualifying round. In 2010-11 they won the Aldershot & District Senior Cup, beating Fleet Town on penalties in the final after a 3-3 draw. After finishing in the bottom three of the Premier Division in 2016–17 the club were relegated to Division One.

However, they finished third in Division One the following season and were promoted back to the Premier Division. When the Premier Division was split in two in 2021, the club were placed in the Premier Division South. They were runners-up in the division in 2022-23, earning promotion to the South Central Division of the Isthmian League as one of the highest ranked runners-up across the step five divisions. The season also saw them win the Aldershot Senior Cup, beating Westfield F.C. 2-0 in the final.

Ground

The club played at the Badshot Lea Recreation Ground until 2007, when they were forced to leave due to it failing ground grading regulations. They then spent several years groundsharing, playing home matches at Cherrywood Road in Farnborough, Godalming Town's Weycourt and Ash United's Shawfield Stadium. The club moved to Camberley Town's Krooner Park for the 2017-18 season, during which the club started redeveloping Westfield Lane in Wrecclesham, the former home ground of Farnham Rugby Club, which had relocated to Monkton Lane. Ahead of the 2019-20 season, Badshot Lea moved into Westfield Lane, playing the inaugural match at the ground against neighbours Aldershot Town in a friendly on 6 July.

MATCH REPORT

v CHERTSEY TOWN

The Curfews have only lost once this season, away to Raynes Park Vale, and have won all their home game to date, sitting on top of the table. If the banter in the clubhouse before the game is anything to go by, the electronic scoreboard would struggle to keep up with Chertsey's goal count. We shall see.

In front of the largest attendance this season for Rovers, upwards of 650, the visitors kick the game off to a bristling start. In the first minute, Ashley Sheppard chests out a long throw from Ben Holden to Aaron Jenkins on the edge of the Chertsey box. As Jenkins cues up his shot, he is taken out by Gianluca Botti, about 20yds from goal. The free kick is whipped in by Antonio Simeone, but a yard over the bar.

At almost the exact same position, but at the other end, Sheppard gives away free-kick just outside the penalty area. A nicely rehearsed kick by Wayne Ridgley and Conor Lee, sees Lee's shot go low to the Oshane Brown's left, but a strong hand turns it round the post. Brown is called into action a minute or two later, when another free kick from Lee, out wide on the right but from an acute angle, is driven hard and low, but held well by the Rovers' keeper.

On 8mins, good combination work from Holden, Jenkins and Lindell Stewart gives Nabeel Ghannam a great opportunity in front of goal. Slipping past his defender, Ghannam's strike is on target, but too easy for Nicholas Jupp.

Both sides now looking for openings in equal measure, but good defensive play from the Rovers back line, quashing any threat that Chertsey have.

A through ball from Ghannam finds Max Oldham wide on the right. Cutting inside, he's brought down for a free-kick. Ghannam takes, but his good delivery is headed out by the Chertsey centre back. On the follow-up, another clumsy challenge on Oldham awards Rovers yet another free-kick. This time, Ghannam floats over Bertie Lloyd, but his challenge on the keeper was considered unfair by the Referee.

After a terrific stop by Brown, Oldham has space to break, playing a great through ball for Jenkins to run on to. The flag went up for offside, which was clear and obvious, but Jenkins put it in the net anyway. No harm in that.

Rovers kept up the pressure as and when the opportunities arose. Sheppard, with is back to goal, feeding out to Ghannam, trying to work an opening, out then to Jenkins, couldn't get his shot away, Chertsey pinned back in their 18yd box, then on to Oldham, again no way through, but a great spell of play from the Rovers' front men.

With Stewart and Holden on our right pressing Scott Rees, we win a throw. Holden goes long to the edge of the box, Ghannam's ambitious overhead kick was worth the try but blocked, the appeal for a handball by a Chertsey defender not given.



Just before half time, a clash between Lee and Holden, gives Chertsey a free-kick on their left and Holden needing treatment. The last action of the game and Lloyd heads the free-kick away. Both sides go into the break having had their fair share of chances, but a lot to feel positive about for Rovers.



The second half started with much the same pace as the first. Now playing up the gentle slope at Alwyns Lane, Ghannam gets round the Chertsey wing back and wins a throw-in on the left deep in their half. Holden's throw is headed away, but Coleman chips the loose ball toward Simeone, but just too high to get a decent header away.

A moments indecision in the middle of the park lets Oliver McCoy in with a chance to run at the Rovers defence. His ball out wide to the right finds Mason Welch-Turner, whose cross is headed away by Simeone. Again Welch-Turner steers the ball back into the danger zone, but Ghannam intercepts passing back to Holden, who smashes it clear.

In the 52nd minute, a mis-timed tackle from behind on Jenkins gives Rees a yellow card, and Rovers a free-kick 25yds out. Ghannam's shot hits the wall, Coleman firing the rebound over the bar. 3mins on and a great ball from Oldham finds Jenkins with plenty of space. The pass down the line for Stewart to run onto was perfect, but the shot skimmed across the face of the goal.

Chertsey's best chance of the game came just before their substitutions. A great deep cross from Wayne Ridgley on the left found McCoy with a golden opportunity. With Brown scrambling across goal, McCoy couldn't get a toe on it and the chance went begging. On 57mins Louis Degand replaces McCoy.


Just after the hour, Rovers make their first substitution, Matthew Feeney-Hill replacing Stewart. The impact was immediate with Feeney-Hill passing through to Jenkins, who should really have returned the favour, but chose to shoot, his effort sailing over the bar. Ghannam then sets up Oldham who burns into the box on the right, takes the ball inside and gets a cracking shot away, but Jupp gets down to it.

From Jupp's distribution Sam Omperon springs the offside trap, his cross blocked by a combination of Simeone and Sheppard. From their corner, Ghannam heads clear setting Oldham off on a run. Passing outside to Feeney-Hill, again his cross just eludes Jenkins. With the game getting close to the end – this could still go either way, but Rovers have had more chances.

After the Ref had added 6mins injury time, Ghannam is dispossessed by Omperon, who charges into the Rovers 18yd box. A great tackle from Coleman is greeted with a penalty appeal, but is waved away. Lloyd then clears the loose ball but is impeded winning a free -kick. Simeone takes quickly, far out to the right finding Feeney-Hill in space. Bringing it down with a great touch, his shot beats the keeper but just skims past the outside of the left post. If there was a chance for a winner, that was it.

In the final minute, a Chertsey free kick is awarded just outside the Rovers penalty area. Looking back to our last game here in the 96th minute, it couldn't happen again could it? Thankfully not – last kick of the game was driven over the bar.

While the Chertsey squad must have felt they had dropped 2 points in this encounter (but still leaving the pitch to rapturous applause) Rovers can be content that this was a point won, with a great performance, and having terminated Chertsey's run of home league wins. Should Chertsey feel hard done by? No, I don't think so. Rovers matched them play for play, and were worthy of a point. Oh, and incidentally, even though it was goalless, it was a great game to watch, with good football on display from both sides.

VALE BACK AT THE SUMMIT

Curfews can't find a way past Rovers, Southall up to third, Tanners and Marlow held, Yellas and Uxbridge hit five whilst Kingfishers and Woods win

Leaders Chertsey Town knew that with only goal difference between them and Raynes Park Vale- and third place Leatherhead only two points further back- they couldn't afford to slip up as Sutton Common Rovers came to call. The Curfews had won their previous NINE matches and hit Corinthian-Casuals for six last time out, but they couldn't manage even a goal this time around. Neither could Rovers, but they'll be much happier with that - and with their point on the road. Town are down to second.

Second place Raynes Park Vale were hoping to go back to the top, but knew that unless Chertsey Town suffered a slip up they'd need to enormously improve their goal difference to take over. That said, they would undoubtedly have noticed that their visitors, bottom side Binfield, had already conceded sixty two goals this season- and it was sixty three after only six minutes, Jordan Gallagher with his fourteenth of the season. Vale went two goals up three minutes before the break, Callum Hope doubling their advantage, and it was certainly three points confirmed when Gallagher added a third before the hour. Brad Sweeney added a fourth with nineteen minutes left, and Chertsey's draw saw Vale take over at the top.

Third place Leatherhead looked to have a tough match as last season's Play Off Finalists Hanworth Villa made the trip to Fetcham Grove, and it looked even tougher when the Villains went ahead on fourteen minutes, Kyen Nicholas with his eleventh of the season. Three minutes before the break the Tanners levelled, Trevan Robinson giving the green hordes something to shout about, but that was the last concerted shouting from the fans of either side, a point each the outcome.

Fourth place Marlow started the day four points behind the leaders with two games in hand, and had won their last eight league matches- but they didn't have a good start against South Park Reigate at Oak Tree Road, the Sparks, who scored four in midweek, going ahead after just seven minutes with Jamarie Brissett's fifth of the season. The Sparks were two up seven minutes later, Sam King converting from the spot, but the hosts then awoke and Dawid Rogalski pulled a goal back five minutes before half time, his penalty his twenty first goal of the season. Could the Sparks hold on? Nearly. Right at the end Khalid Simmo delighted the home fans with an equaliser, and two-two was the final score.

Fifth place Southall have dropped from first to fifth after two narrow defeats, and hoped to get back to winning ways as they welcomed Hartley Wintney. Those two defeats followed a long, long unbeaten run, whilst their visitors were in decent form too, four unbeaten. The All went ahead midway through the first half, Anthony O'Connor with his eighth of the season, and they doubled their advantage just after the hour, Ryan Hope making it two. That was how it finished, Southall up to third.

Uxbridge started the weekend in ninth spot, and hoped to close the gap on the top five as they welcomed Corinthian-Casuals to Honeycroft. The hosts have been the very example of inconsistency, with four wins and five defeats from their previous nine matches, but they did come from behind to defeat Chipstead last time out and new signing Dan Williams opened the scoring just after the quarter hour mark. Eight minutes before the break Lewis Cole made it two-nil, and a moment after the restart George Moore made it three. It was soon four, Rhys Murrell- Williamson with that one, and with nine-teen minutes left Mahlondo Martin added a fifth as his side climbed to sixth.

Westfield welcomed Ashford Town to Woking Park. The hosts picked up their first draw in ten matches last time out, and they must have started a habit as they did it again, neither side managing a goal.



Thatcham Town played host to Chipstead. The Kingfishers started the day in twelfth place but had lost only one of their previous seven, whilst the travelling Chips were on their worst run of the season, and took six consecutive defeats with them to Berkshire, so it wasn't too much of a surprise when Town broke the deadlock on fifty three minutes, Curtis Angel with the goal. Muhamadou Ceesay quickly made it two-nil, and right at the end David Nyarko added a third, the Kingfishers up to ninth.

Met Police, a point above the bottom two at kick off, welcomed the side five points and four places ahead of them, Ascot United. Met won for the first time in ten matches last time out- although last time out had been three weeks previously, against South Park Reigate. The travelling Yellas also had recent experience of the Sparks, in their case far more recent, as they lost four-one in Reigate in midweek. Their last two wins had been followed by immediate defeat- but they could also say that their last two defeats had been followed by immediate wins, so they hoped that pattern would continue, and they started superbly. Brendan Matthew is having a fabulous campaign for United, and within a minute he'd added his twentieth of the season to put his side ahead. The boys in blue levelled on the quarter hour, Laurence Ernest making it one-one, but just before the half hour Matthew did it again, making it two-one, and seven minutes before half time new signing Morgan Taylor made it three-one.

Harry Grant surely made the points safe when adding a fourth on fifty two minutes, although Met then hit back, Charlie Brown bringing it back to four-two. Two minutes from time Taylor got the fifth, and the Yellas climbed to thirteenth.

Northwood must wonder whether their success of 22-23 was something of a dream, as 23-24 had so far been mostly nightmares- but perhaps the Woods had finally stopped eating cheese before going to bed, as they awoke to defeat Guernsey at the Skyline Stadium. After a goalless first half Northwood went ahead on fifty five minutes, Reece Cameron with the goal, but the ever reliable Matt Loaring quickly levelled for the Green Lions. It was next goal wins, and it went to the hosts, Kofi Anokye-Boadi scoring with nineteen minutes left to secure three points for his side and lift them to sixteenth.



THE UNTOLD GAME Charlton's Ballon d'Or Disaster

Allan Simonsen was undeniably a great footballer. The Dane was European Footballer of the Year in 1977, beating out the likes of Kevin Keegan and Johan Cruyff to the award. He played for Barcelona, had been their top goalscorer and found the winning goal in the Cup Winners Cup final, securing a much needed European trophy for the Catalan side. But when they paid a world record fee for Diego Maradona in 1982, it threw his position into doubt. Spanish football at the time allowed only two European players on the pitch at the time. The Argentine would obviously start, and when it became clear that Bernd Schuster would as well, Simonsen took his leave



of the club for new pastures. Nobody could have expected those pastures to be... Charlton Athletic.

Simonsen had offers from across Europe, but the front runners turned out to be Barcelona's hated rivals Real Madrid, and Tottenham Hotspur. Given the tensions between the two Spanish sides, North London seemed the most likely prospect for the Dane, where Spurs had just achieved their highest finish in a decade and were looking at pushing beyond the fourth place they had found themselves in the previous season. But then Simonsen threw a spanner into those plans, stating that he would enjoy a more relaxed footballing environment, something that White Hart Lane didn't really offer. Struggling at the wrong end of the Second Division, Charlton owner Mark Hulyer took his chance, blowing both Tottenham and Real Madrid out of the water with a £325,000 bid. Barcelona accepted on one condition: all of the money was paid up front. They didn't trust in Mark Hulyer's vision any more than anyone else.

The Valley at that time could take 75,000, but hadn't seen even 40,000 for 35 years. Charlton averaged 7000 fans for their home games, but Hulyer wasn't content to sit at that level. The colossal bid for Simonsen, with high salary (by Second Division standards) and no bank to help finance the deal, was a gamble, but the interest he would generate, and the success he would bring, would boost attendances so considerably that he would soon repay the money on the pitch. It was an idea with sadly predictable consequences.

Initially, Hulyer was right, to an extent. 4000 fans turned up for the reserve game where Simonsen would first kick a ball in a Charlton shirt, and more than 10,000 saw him play his first game for the first team, a gate increase of 50%. And Simonsen, European Footballer of the Year only five years earlier, took to his new team with ease. That first game ended in defeat against Middlesbrough, but Charlton fans saw their star signing score his first goal, and create chance after chance for his teammates.

Having dropped from the pinnacle of European Football to the Second Division, the Dane's first 16 games for the club saw a slight upturn in fortunes for Charlton. He scored nine goals, providing more for his teammates, and usually won man of the match; not a huge surprise for a player deemed a peer of Johan Cruyff.

But it was also a frustrating experience for Simonsen. His new teammates were not up to his speed, and incisive through balls, inch-perfect crosses, and magical moments were wasted by teammates who were always behind him. He couldn't do it alone, as evidenced by a 7-1 drubbing against Burnley.

Simonsen did have bright moments, the most notable against Chelsea following that Burnley game. Charlton took a two goal lead in the first half, but let it slip before the hour. Simonsen took charge of the game after that, gliding around the pitch as though he were still a Barcelona player, beating Chelsea defenders that, like most in the Second Division, were far below his level, and scoring two goals, creating another, for a 5-2 win. He had also doubled the attendance at Charlton, to a peak of 13000, but it wasn't enough. Just five months after signing him, the south London galactico was causing financial problems. Hulyer was looking to sell.

Offloading a Ballon d'Or winner was a simpler, but much less profitable, prospect for Charlton than it had been for Barcelona. Fearing this exact situation, Simonsen's agent had put a release clause into the contract he had signed. When Hulyer approached him to explain that they couldn't afford his wages, the agent triggered the clause and Simonsen left the club in January

of 1983. He went back to his homeland, and joined his childhood club VB to see out his relaxed career. Things for Charlton were not so cosy.

Facing the massive financial losses of the Simonsen experiment, Charlton were soon also given an even bigger tax bill of more than £400,000. The club finished that season five places lower than they had the previous, and facing bankruptcy. The club was placed into administration and force to leave The Valley altogether, to share Selhurst Park with Crystal Palace.



So the signing of Allan Simonsen did have the huge impact on Charlton that Hulyer had claimed, just not the one he had hoped for.

SUTTON COMMON ROVERS

FORMED: 1978

NICKNAME:

THE COMMONERS

JUST A S..T SUNDAY SIDE

Ah, the cry from the Eastbourne Town fans back in the day as they romped to a 2-0 lead in the Vase, before we struck back to win 3-2.

Well, truth be told that's where it all started back in 1978, when INRAD FC took to the field, the club being founded by current Chairman Alan Salmon. Not long after Centre 21 came about following a sponsorship deal with a local youth centre.

Once players left having reached 21, a new name came about: Sutton Common Rovers FC, which quickly abbreviated to SCR followed by whichever public house sponsored the team.

Seasons followed in the Leatherhead & District, Mitcham & District, and Croydon & District Sunday league, with varying degrees of success before Darren Salmon took the plunge and moved the team into Saturday football.

SATURDAY SUCCESS

The 2004/5 season saw that Saturday move. After a couple of seasons in the Surrey South East Combination and the Middlesex County League we took our place in the Combined Counties League for the 2008/09 season.

Darren made the bold statement that he wanted to be an Isthmian side within five seasons. Well, it took a bit longer but we eventually got there.

Our time in the CCL was full of ups and downs. Missing out on promotion in our opening season on goal difference, by 1 goal (as it turned out a missed penalty against Dorking in our penultimate game was key as it meant they had a 1 goal better goal difference than us).

Promotion followed the next season, and two seasons in the Premier culminated with relegation back to Division 1 in 2011/12. We bounced back up immediately, but then spent three seasons struggling in the Premier division before a change in fortunes in 2016/17 saw a mid-table finish.

It was all upwards after that, missing out on promotion with 3rd and 2nd finishes by one place in consecutive seasons. However, we finished top on PPG after two abandoned seasons to finally move to the Isthmian League.

IT'S A FAMILY THING

As said, chairman Alan Salmon founded the side back in 1978, and his boys, Darren and Justin, both played for the club once the were old enough.

Darren progressed to First Team manager, while we were still a Sunday side, something he continued to the end of the 22/23 season (c29 years)

Justin has since been co-manager of the First team with Darren and reserve team manager, all along-side managing the Sunday sides. He is now the club secretary.

We were also ahead of the game in terms of getting ladies involved in the club. Alan's daughter Tracy joined the fun when the SCR Colts were formed and quickly established herself behind the tea bar counter.

For good measure her other half Mark became youth secretary, a role that he held until the start of this season.

Throw into that that all Alan's grandchildren (Sam: #forever7, forever missed; Tyler, Reece and Blake, and Ethan) all played for the club, with Blake and Reece now involved on matchdays. As you see, we are truly a family club.



CUP GLORY (ish)

We have a proud cup-fighting tradition, often getting the better of higher ranked sides.

It's not all been glory though as we suffered heartbreak twice in finals, losing 1-0 to Staines Lammas in the CCL Division 1 final in the 2008/09 season, and the following year we lost to Sutton Utd Reserves in the Surrey Premier Cup Final, 8-7 on penalties after a 1-1 draw.

The 2016/17 season saw the club secure it's first Saturday trophy with a 4-1 win over Camberley Town in the Southern Combination Challenge Cup.

Semi final defeats followed the next season in the Southern Combination Cup and the EL Records Premier Challenge Cup, which saw a heartbreaking 97th minute goal against Worcester Park to lose 3-2.

In 2018/19 we reached two cup finals, with defeat after extra time against Walton Casuals 4-2 in the Southern Combination Cup. The club finally secured the EL Records Premier Challenge Cup. An 84th minute strike by Matt Farrell securing a 1-0 win over CB Hounslow Utd.

There has been some success in the FA Vase, with the 5th Round reached in the 2019/20 season, but it ended in disappointment away at Western League Bitton AFC when we lost 2-1.

The FA Cup has been hit and miss with exits in the Extra-Preliminary Round before the 2021/22 season saw us reach the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time.
