# WELCOME, SALUT, HOWDY, WILLKOMEN

Good evening ladies and gentlemen and welcome to the Whyteleafe Sports Arena for tonights Isthmian South Central league fixture.

We would like to welcome tonight's opponent Leatherhead FC. We hope their players officials and supporters have a pleasant short stay with us this evening.

We would also like to welcome todays match officials, referee Mr Neil Morrison and his assistants Mr Shkumbin Sherifi and Mr Sobastian Frazer, we hope they also enjoy their stay with us tonight.

It's been a over a month since our last home game, and who can forget that dramatic 2-1 win over Guernsey, with Nabeel Ghannam and Ashley Sheppard both scoring deep into stoppage time to give us the win.

We have progressed for the first time, and been knocked out of the FA Trophy, with wins over Merstham (goals from Courtney Swaby, Antonio Simeone and Gabriel Odunaike) and a loss to Badshot Lea (report on that one later in the programme).

Whilst we have been unbeaten in the league during the month, with two wins and a draw. After the Guernsey win our other league win saw us crush a struggling Corinthian Causuals 5-0 (Simeone, Odunaike, Ghannam, Charlie Martin and Swaby on the scoresheet).

Last weekend we made our first ever trip to Ascot Utd, and an excellent performance saw us pick up a 1-1 draw, with Conan Torpey on the scoresheet. The fact that Ascot's supporters voted their keeper Hugo Sobte as man of the match says it all really.

Onto tonights opponents, and they were most people's pre-season tip for the title, and in fairness have started their campaign in strong form, currently sitting in second spot in the table, having 13 points from 5 games—the only points dropped being a 0-0 draw against Westfield. In fact, should they win tonight they will move top of the table.

Last season the sides met on three occasions, Leatherhead winning a thrilling first game of 2023 at Fetcham Grove by 4-3, a late Dave Tarpey strike giving them the points, whilst in the return a Max Oldham goal gave us a share of the spoils in a 1-1 draw.

There was also an entertaining 2-2 draw (goals from Liam Holden and Brian Testolin) in the Velocity Cup, with Leatherhead progressing on penalties.

We would also like to give a warm welcome back last season's skipper Tyler Cox, who now plys his trade with Leatherhead.

In other news, the U18's started their league campaign with a 4-2 win over Maidstone Utd, but have mainly been playing FA Youth Cup matches, they have since our last game here seen off Phoenix Sports 4-2 and Lewes 6-4 and were in action yesterday against Croydon. Fingers crossed they got the job done.

# TODAY'S OPPONENTS LEATHERHEAD

**FORMED: 1871** 

### NICKNAME: The Tanners



**LEATHERHEAD FOOTBALL CLUB** can trace its history back to the formation of Leatherhead Rose in 1907. Rose were crowned Champions of the Dorking & District League in 1910 and 1919 before joining the Kingston and District League where they won the League title three times, the last in 1938-39. Leatherhead United were formed in 1924 and, in 1925-6, won Division One of the Sutton and District League. In the early 1930s, United joined the Surrey Junior League becoming Champions in 1933-4

After the War, officials of the two clubs met and in May 1946, Leatherhead Football Club was officially formed at a public meeting. United's Fetcham Grove ground was to be used as the home ground. The Tanners went on to win four consecutive Surrey Senior League Championships before spells in the Metropolitan, Delphian and Corinthian Leagues. Tanners were Corinthian League champions in 1963 before moving into the Athenian League. Leatherhead won promotion from Division One at the end of the first season and inaugurated their floodlights with a match against a Fulham side. Leatherhead won the Surrey Senior Cup for the first, and to date, only time in 1969. After being elected into the Isthmian League, Leatherhead made national headlines in 1974-5 when they reached the Fourth Round proper of the FA Cup, defeating League sides Colchester Utd and Brighton & Hove Albion before bowing out to First Division Leicester City 2-3. In subsequent seasons, the Tanners defeated two more Football League sides at the Grove – Cambridge United and Northampton Town.

After the disappointment of defeat in FA Amateur Cup semi-finals in 1971 and 1974, the Tanners finally reached Wembley Stadium in 1978 but were beaten in the FA Trophy Final. The Club then entered a period of decline and were relegated in 1983 and in 1990, slipped down into Division Two South but were back in Division One in 1997. Finances were a problem and in the summer of 2000, the club was within a few days of folding but was saved by its supporters who took over following a crisis meeting.

After the disappointment of defeat in FA Amateur Cup semi-finals in 1971 and 1974, the Tanners finally reached Wembley Stadium in 1978 but were beaten in the FA Trophy Final. The Club then entered a period of decline and were relegated in 1983 and in 1990, slipped down into Division Two South but were back in Division One in 1997. Finances were a problem and in the summer of 2000, the club was within a few days of folding but was saved by its supporters who took over following a crisis meeting. In 2006-7, Leatherhead were the lowest ranked team to reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup, losing 1-2 at Football League side, Torquay United. Mick Sullivan was appointed First Team Manager in May 2009. Under Sullivan's guidance, the club had its most successful season in years, winning the Isthmian League Cup (the first major trophy for some 40 years) and finishing the season in fifth place in the League before losing a play-off semi-final. The following season, a dramatic play-off victory against Dulwich Hamlet (4-3 after extra time), saw The Tanners return to the Premier Division for the first time since 1983. Tanners stay lasted just the one season though. In 2013-14 Tanners reached the play offs again, this time edging out Guernsey 3-2, before winning a penalty shootout at Folkestone Invicta to return to the Ryman Premier Division.

Sammy Moore was appointed in the summer of 2017. In his first managerial job Sammy steered Tanners to the second round of the FA Cup, a County Cup Final and a top eight finish in the League before departing for Concord Rangers along with the majority of the team. He was replaced by former Margate boss Nikki Bull who, despite having to rebuild the squad, took the team to an 8th place finish narrowly missing out on the play-offs.

After a poor start to the 2021-22 season Luke Tuffs was appointed to the Fetcham Grove hot seat in January 2022, and his team very nearly escaped relegation after a number of battling performances. However, the Tanners missed out by one point, and were relegated on the final of the season on a points per game calculation.

The 22/23 season started slowly for the Tanners and after a dozen game, Luke Tuffs decided to step down, and he was replaced by Hayden Bird and results improved, taking the team from 17th place to 7th. only missing a play-off position by one point.

# MATCH REPORT v BADSHOT LEA (FA TROPHY)

Before anyone had got comfortable in their seats, Badshot were a goal to the good. In the third minute, after conceding a corner, Steven Sylla takes the uncontested delivery on the 6yd box for the easiest of tap-ins. Did time stand still for Rovers' at that point?

Rovers fight back will a good throw-in from Isy Nzelo to Gabriel Odunaike, who fends off a heavy challenge from the Badshot defence, turns and feeds his pass to Charlie Martin. Martin's shot is deflected out for a corner. Courtney Swaby delivers on cue, Bertie Lloyd heading back across goal, but keeper Harry Cawdron claims.

After a great piece of foot work from Aaron Jenkins as he approaches the Badshot 18yd box, one on one with Cawdron, the keeper denies the chance, and his distribution sets up Sylla, who plays out wide to Lamin Ceesay, his left foot strike demanding a great save by James Dillon.

Nabeel Ghannam sweeps the ball into the path of Odunaike who is now has only the keeper to beat, but Cawdron gets a hand on it. Swaby is there to pick up the loose ball and shoots from outside the penalty area, Cawdron tipping it out. Swaby drills the corner hard toward the penalty spot, where Nzelo executes as good a header as your likely to see, finding the lower right hand corner. Back on equal terms.

Jordan Wilson picked up a caution for a late challenge mid-way through the fist half, just as the game was levelling up. A succession of Badshot corners then put Rovers under pressure. Reece Robins takes quickly to Kai Allsopp, who gives straight

back, Robins cross finding Sylla. His header looked nailed on, but Dillon steered it past the post.

On 28mins, as Rovers soak up the pressure from Badshot, a poorly struck backpass from Matt Tanton puts Dillon under pressure, the 50:50 challenge with Sylla sees the tall no9 go down in the box. Sylla then duly dispatches the penalty, restoring Badshot's lead. A minute later a telling cross from Baback Dehgani is headed over by L.Ceesay. Could have been three.

With half-time looming Holden again clears our lines, with a great ball to Swaby who tries to jinx his way through the Badshot defence, laying off to Charlie Martin. His cross gets through to Odunaike, but the ball didn't fall kindly and his shot went wide.

Just before the break Swaby, who was clearly frustrated by the decisions going against us, was taken aside by the Ref for a chat, with Tanton in attendance. Nothing given, but a warning nonetheless.

As the half came to a close, during the break, Rovers will need to settle and find another gear.

3 minutes from the restart, great work from Badshot's Kai Allsopp, driving 25yds down the right, his low cross into the penalty area is met by Tanton, who turns and fires the ball pointblank into Holden, L.Ceesay slotting the loose ball over Dillon. Nothing either of the two Rovers defenders could do – just unfortunate. Badshot restore their two goal lead. After 53 minutes Rovers make the first of two double substitutions. Danny Divine replacing Nzelo, and Ashley Sheppard replacing Ghannam.



A long throw from Tanton finds Odunaike, who shields the ball well, turns and slides a pass through to Swaby. Swaby's shot is pushed away by the Badshot keeper, and their defender checks it back to Cawdron – for all the world looking like a back-pass but nothing given. Wishful thinking maybe.

The second Rovers double substitution on 66mins sees Conan Torpey replacing Jenkins and Max Oldham replacing Martin. The impact was an immediate threat to Badshot, with Swaby twisting and turning their defence, pushing the ball out wide to Max Oldham. Oldham's cross was pin-point to Conan Torpey, but the header was just wide.

Around the hour mark, our defence was given a hard job to contain Badshot's pressure. Tanton blocks an absolute screamer of a shot from L.Ceesay, and then Sylla on the follow-up. Rovers then create a chance for Wilson, after a good move from Torpey putting Wilson within shooting distance, but a deflection puts the ball out for a corner. Badshot then get back on the break from the corner kick, Sylla, both Ceesay's and Dehgani, 4 against 3, but Tanton heads the danger clear.

On 67mins Sylla lays the ball out to L.Ceesay, whose shot hits the cross bar, Sylla latches onto the rebound, but his shot is blocked. Another close call. Three minutes later, a great ball from Holden out to Danny Divine on the right, wins a corner, which Divine takes quickly finding Oldham on the edge of box. Oldham's floats his cross to Torpey, who heads past the keeper, 3-2.

Short-lived though, on 75mins A.Ceesay works himself some space out on their left, cuts into the edge of the 18yd box and whips in a shot into the bottom right corner. Restoring the deficit 4-2. Dillon picked up a caution, as he felt there was an infringement in the build-up, and expressed it so with more passion than the Ref felt appropriate.

Badshot then make their first substitution, Billy Oram replacing Reece Robins, on 77mins. Shortly followed by Rovers final change Siao Blackwood replacing Wilson. Good play from Odunaike playing Torpey through into the box, but his shot is deflected out for a corner. Swaby takes to the near post, setting up a header for Holden, which just squeaks over.

At 80mins it was clear that Rovers were becoming rattled, and frustrations running high. The normally ever-smiling Swaby was cautioned for reacting to a challenge he was alleged to have made, and would need to put this behind him. After two minutes a great quick long throw from Tanton on the left puts Odunaike in space on the 18yd box, his shot parried by the keeper, Oldham on the follow-up slots home. 4-3. We're still in this.

Good work from Divine on the right wins a corner late on, which Swaby takes, delivering into a sea of yellow. Divine and Torpey both get headers in as the ball is pushed back out, but the keeper saves. Was that our last chance? Badshot's final substitutions on 82mins sees Tane Caubo replace A.Ceesay and Rock Moses replace Allsopp. Almost immediately brought into the action Oram feeds a great through ball for Tane Caubo, but Dillon denies with a good save.

With Rovers' clearly distracted by a commotion ongoing in the stands and not focussed on what was happening on the pitch, Sylla again pops out of nowhere into the penalty area and pushes the ball under Dillon for his hattrick, and Badshot's fifth. That sealed it for the Baggies. To add insult to injury Swaby then got a second yellow, along with his marching orders, following a challenge executed in frustration rather than malice. Game over.

# The Untold Game

# **Better than Cruyff**

Johan Cruyff is a legend. Everybody knows that. He is revered in his home country and across the globe for both his ability on the pitch, and his genius off it. The Dutchman is undoubtedly one of the greatest of all time, with a tiny handful of players that can claim to have played the game better. But Cruyff himself only ever conceded that one man was better than him, one man that most have never heard of. Willy Dullens.

Dullens was born in the final months of the Second World War, in the Dutch village of Broeksittard, surviving a conflict-induced famine in his early months. Rarely without a ball at his feet, Dullens trained for six hours each day, and spent every night reading Voetballen Doe Je Zo, 'This is How you Play Football'. He was quickly a master with the ball at his feet. Returning from the pit one day, his father asked young Willy how many keepie uppies he had managed that day. The answer - 3500 - was astonishing. When he reached 6000, he stopped. Nobody, he believed, would ever beat that.

He played for his local amateur side, using his brother's birth certificate to trick authorities when he was just 14. He shone against fully grown adults. It didn't take long for the professionals to take notice, and he was snapped up by local second tier side Sittardia, along with his two brothers.

Dullens could not have been more different to Cruyff. While the mercurial Total Footballer represented rebellious youth in the capital, the Sittardia midfielder embodied the working class and strict Christian values of Broeksittard. He never smoked, he never drank. After playing poorly in one game, he realised he had gone to bed too late and set himself a bedtime. He was quiet, and let his feet do the talking.

18 goals in his debut season saw Sittardia promoted. Although he wasn't able to keep the minnows in the top flight, his talent was noticed. He started to get called up to the national youth teams, where he first encountered Cruyff. They would eventually become friends, but Dullens couldn't believe how much the Ajax man smoked.

To treat his body that way was inconceivable. He noted how talented Cruyff was though, but never felt inferior to him. He would later recall that they never lost a match they played together.





Despite relegation, a series of wonder goals ensured that he was not forgotten. Whilst playing in the second tier, he got his first Oranje senior call up, and mesmerised an experienced Belgian defence at De Kuip. The day after his debut, Dullens was the second coming, around whom Dutch football should be built. Two weeks later, he did the same to Scotland.



Despite playing in the second tier, Dullens was named Dutch player of the year.

Ahead of Cruyff. This would be his greatest accolade, and his undoing. Feyenoord spent the summer trying to sign the young man that could have them challenging Ajax once again, but he lined up for Sittardia once more.

In a friendly before the season opener, with his side 4-1 up, his teammates relaxed. But not Dullens. He demanded nothing less than perfection, and there was a crowd to entertain. Dribble after mazy dribble frustrated the Vitesse defence, until finally one challenge came in too late, and snapped his knee. The referee didn't even stop the game, and it was barely reported. Nobody understood the seriousness of the incident, except Dullens himself.

The Sittardia doctor told him to go home and rest, despite his insistence that he should go to the hospital. He sat on the sidelines for four weeks, as his side started poorly. When he came back, he was in pain. Ice didn't help, and his manager had no sympathy, needing him for a relegation battle. He even received two more caps for the Netherlands, but it wasn't the same player.

Travelling to the best knee doctor in Europe didn't help, and after an eight hour surgery the worst was confirmed. Dullens retired in 1969, at the age of 22, but not before one final swansong. Cruyff and his former teammates arranged a friendly, as a way of supporting him. In front of 55,000 fans, the great Dutch hope limped out onto the pitch at the Amsterdam Arena. He knew, deep down, that this would be his last time in a stadium for a long time. The pain of not playing the game was too much. He is one of footballs great what ifs.

# A BRIEF HISTORY OF: SUTTON COMMON ROVERS



# JUST A S..T SUNDAY SIDE

Ah, the cry from the Eastbourne Town fans back in the day as they romped to a 2-0 lead in the Vase, before we struck back to win 3-2.

Well, truth be told that's where it all started back in 1978, when INRAD FC took to the field, the club being founded by current Chairman Alan Salmon. Not long after Centre 21 came about following a sponsorship deal with a local youth centre.

Once players left having reached 21, a new name came about: Sutton Common Rovers FC, which quickly abbreviated to SCR followed by whichever public house sponsored the team.

Seasons followed in the Leatherhead & District, Mitcham & District, and Croydon & District Sunday league, with varying degrees of success before Darren Salmon took the plunge and moved the team into Saturday football.

### SATURDAY SUCCESS

The 2004/5 season saw that Saturday move. After a couple of seasons in the Surrey South East Combination and the Middlesex County League we took our place in the Combined Counties League for the 2008/09 season.

Darren made the bold statement that he wanted to be an Isthmian side within five seasons. Well, it took a bit longer but we eventually got there.

Our time in the CCL was full of ups and downs. Missing out on promotion in our opening season on goal difference, by 1 goal (as it turned out a missed penalty against Dorking in our penultimate game was key as it meant they had a 1 goal better goal difference than us).

Promotion followed the next season, and two seasons in the Premier culminated with relegation back to Division 1 in 2011/12. We bounced back up immediately, but then spent three seasons struggling in the Premier division before a change in fortunes in 2016/17 saw a mid-table finish.

It was all upwards after that, missing out on promotion with 3rd and 2nd finishes by one place in consecutive seasons. However, we finished top on PPG after two abandoned seasons to finally move to the Isthmian League.



# IT'S A FAMILY THING

As said, chairman Alan Salmon founded the side back in 1978, and his boys, Darren and Justin, both played for the club once the were old enough.

Darren progressed to First Team manager, in around 2000 while we were still a Sunday side, something he has continued to the present day.

Justin has since been co-manager of the First team with Darren and reserve team manager, all alongside managing the Sunday sides. He is now the club secretary.

We were also ahead of the game in terms of getting ladies involved in the club. Alan's daughter Tracy joined the fun when the SCR Colts were formed and quickly established herself behind the tea bar counter.

For good measure her other half Mark became youth secretary, a role that he held until the start of this season.

Throw into that that all Alan's grandchildren (Sam: #forever7, forever missed; Tyler, Reece and Blake, and Ethan) all played for the club, with Blake and Reece now involved on matchdays. As you see, we are truly a family club.



# **CUP GLORY (ish)**

We have a proud cup-fighting tradition, often getting the better of higher ranked sides.

It's not all been glory though as we suffered heartbreak twice in finals, losing 1-0 to Staines Lammas in the CCL Division 1 final in the 2008/09 season, and the following year we lost to Sutton Utd Reserves in the Surrey Premier Cup Final, 8-7 on penalties after a 1-1 draw.

The 2016/17 season saw the club secure it's first Saturday trophy with a 4-1 win over Camberley Town in the Southern Combination Challenge Cup.

Semi final defeats followed the next season in the Southern Combination Cup and the EL Records Premier Challenge Cup, which saw a heartbreaking 97th minute goal against Worcester Park to lose 3-2.

In 2018/19 we reached two cup finals, with defeat after extra time against Walton Casuals 4-2 in the Southern Combination Cup. The club finally secured the EL Records Premier Challenge Cup. An 84th minute strike by Matt Farrell securing a 1-0 win over CB Hounslow Utd.

There has been some success in the FA Vase, with the 5th Round reached in the 2019/20 season, but it ended in disappointment away at Western League Bitton AFC when we lost 2-1.
